The SKYWARN participation by amateur radio operators is a public service which saves lives. We should be proud of the efforts made by our club members in this program. The annual training provided by the National Weather Service on February 9 can help us all recognize the hazards associated with severe storms.

The CodeRED Weather Warning system is available to Grayson County residents in the path of severe weather. This service is provided by the Grayson County Office of Emergency Management and the Cities of Bells, Collinsville, Denison, Dorchester, Gunter, Howe, Knollwood, Pottsboro, Sadler, Sherman, Southmayd, Tioga, Tom Bean, Van Alstyne, Whitesboro, and Whitewright.

You can sign-up all of your phones – cell, home, business – to receive alerts for any combination of severe weather warnings at <http://www.co.grayson.tx.us> or call 903-813-4321 for assistance with enrollment. Your contact information remains private. It is only used for severe weather alerts and other emergency notifications.

I am requesting that all Alpha and Bravo Team Members reply to our Volunteer Coordinator, Jessie Liles, by email to: grayson_county_volunteer_coordinator@hotmail.com to advise of your availability to participate in a drill/community education campaign scheduled for Saturday, February 27, 2010.

There are two opportunities for service:

1) For any period of time beginning at 12:30 p.m. and ending at 4:30 p.m., helping to man the telephone bank in the EOC to assist with telephone enrollments in the CodeRED system (requires answering the telephone and using a computer for entry of data into the online entry form); or

2) Participation in a door-to-door drill. We need to practice/drill on an activity that requires CERT to go door-to-door. (This will help in the future in the event of catastrophic disaster impacting communications, water supplies, power, etc., for an extended period of time requiring welfare checks of large areas of the County.) We will use this drill activity to help blanket a small area of the County with information designed to help residents avail themselves of the CodeRED service at the same time an CodeRED ALL CALL has been issued to the County reminding them to sign up. CERT sub-teams of Alpha and Bravo will be given public information for distribution and directed to preplanned areas within, and a small area outside, the Tom Bean city limits. The door-to-door activity will begin at approximately 1 PM but CERT members will be required to report for duty at 12:30 PM. You will then be organized into groups and, assisted in communications by our Grayson County Amateur Radio Club CERT members, begin to cover the area going door-to-door. All drill activity will conclude at no later than 4:30 PM. If you are available, you will be given more specific information related to:

- 1) appropriate attire; 2) communications; 3) credentialing; 4) vehicle door signs for identification;
- 5) your specific duty area; 6) public education information for distribution;
- 6) full CERT drill organization and assignments; and 7) where to report for duty that day.

YOU DO NOT HAVE TO ATTEND ANY OTHER MEETINGS TO PARTICIPATE. YOU SIMPLY NEED TO RESPOND ADVISING OF YOUR AVAILABILITY AND PREFERENCE FOR DUTY. This

drill activity simply requires that you be available for duty between 12:30 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. on Saturday, February 27, 2010.

There are organizational meetings for drill planning for certain CERT members who will be providing drill organizational and planning support but those meetings are for requested team members only. The only time requirement to participate in this drill is on Saturday, February 27, 2010.

This kind of drill activity is so important to help keep CERT members familiar with ICS organizational concepts and the rules of activations. I hope everyone can participate.

If we do not hear from you by email, a group of team members will be making personal telephone calls so if you aren't available that Saturday shoot us an email now so that we won't bother you! J

One last word: we will be analyzing our response from members to this request made by email to ascertain our organizational capacities by email for slow moving events. We would appreciate an email reply to both of us if it is at all possible.

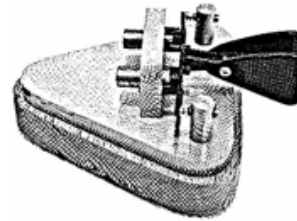

Sunspot Propagation de K7RA

As soon as sunspot 1041 went over the horizon at the end of January, sunspot 1043 emerged, high in our Sun's northern hemisphere. Average daily sunspot number this week fell over 13 points to 14.6, and average daily solar flux declined nearly 7 points to 75. Geomagnetic activity was up, and the average daily planetary A index rose 2 points to 5.1.

Average daily sunspot number for January was 21.3, and the 3-month trailing average, centered on December, was approximately 15.2. Like last month, the average for the month greater than the 3-month average centered on the previous month is a good trend.

The difference between the monthly average sunspot number and the trailing 3-month average has been positive since September. The difference for November, December and January was 0.6, 5.5 and 6.2. For 2009, the 3-month average centered on January through December resolved to two digits beyond the decimal point was 2.19, 2.02, 1.49, 2.01, 4.23, 5.2, 4, 4, 4.64, 7.1, 10.16 and 15.15.

Predicted planetary A index for February 5-9 is 5, 10, 12, 12 and 5. Predicted solar flux for those same days is 80, 82, 85, 88 and 90. Geophysical Institute Prague sees quiet conditions February 5, active February 6, quiet to unsettled February 7, quiet February 8, active February 9, quiet to unsettled February 10-11.

CWops is international in scope, membership and management. Its focus is the use of CW, whether for contesting, DXing or ragchewing. Moreover, it promotes every form of sending -- if it's CW, CWops supports it!

From the Desk of your PIO –

The role of the PIO is usually to provide information from within the ham community to the rest of the world (the ‘unenlightened’ ?????) Today I would like to bring a new regulatory issue to your attention. It doesn’t impact us as hams, but there may be other activities we are involved in as a result of our ham background where this information is relevant.

Effective 12 June 2010 the use of any wireless microphone in the frequency range of 698 MHz to 806 MHz must cease. This includes ALL uses whether licensed under part 74 or not. It is very common for wireless microphones in this frequency range to be utilized by schools, churches, theaters, theme parks, conference centers, and musicians. There is no provision for a waiver, license or special authorization for continued use after that date.

It has been publicized that this frequency range will be turned over to Public Safety and 4G wireless devices for consumers (read that as new cell phone and other subscription services) on the one year anniversary of nationwide Digital TV service. In specific cases, the wireless microphones may need to discontinue use earlier if a licensee begins testing of equipment or notifies the FCC of intent to start testing. In these cases use must stop within 60 days of such notification. The FCC reminds everyone that violation of its rules can lead to significant monetary forfeitures (fines) and criminal prosecution. When it comes to Public Safety, radio interference can have devastating consequences.

Speak to your local church or school about their sound equipment. There may be nobody at that organization that would receive the notice they needed to discontinue use. You may check here www.fcc.gov/cgb/wirelessmicrophones

2010 Skywarn Training

Warning meteorologist Eric Martello from the Fort Worth/Dallas NWS office presented the annual SKYWARN Training for Grayson County on February 9, 2010 at Grayson County College in the Center for Work Place Learning auditorium. My count on the number of amateur radio operators attending was about 23, with total attendance at 85.

SKYWARN NETS

I try to keep up with what is happening with the weather and what we might expect in North Texas. I start the process several days before we are expecting a severe or significant weather event in our area. I watch the local news media outlets to see what they are forecasting, I look at the Storm Prediction Centers web page (<http://www.spc.noaa.gov>), the Norman Oklahoma Weather Service Office web page (<http://www.srh.noaa.gov/oun>) and the Fort Worth-Dallas NWS office web page (<http://www.srh.noaa.gov/fwd>). I, along with others receive daily updates on impending severe weather from the Fort Worth-Dallas NWS office.

The closer the severe weather event gets to us the closer attention I pay to what it is doing and what is forecast for our county. I have two primary radar sites on internet I use, one is the NWS RIDGE radar available on the Fort Worth-Dallas NWS office web site and the other is WEATHER TAP (<http://www.weathertap.com/>), which is a subscription radar site. Each site has features that are a great help to us, the NWS site shows land marks, rivers, highways and also shows the warning boxes for tornados and severe thunderstorms. The WEATHER TAP web site has a feature called "RADAR LAB" that will not only show you the NEXRAD radar, but the track of the storms, weather advisories, watches and warnings.

These are some of the tools that I use to keep up with what's going on with the weather. Of course we also monitor SKYWARN nets in adjoining counties to find out what sort of weather they are having and what their spotters are seeing and experiencing. Counties directly west of us, Cooke and Montague, use the volunteer fire departments for spotting and Mac, K5QAM usually monitors them and passes that information along to our net.

We may or may not call up a formal SKYWARN net. We will usually run as a informal net for a while, then if we see that the severe weather is heading towards or nearing our county we will open the EOC and roll over into a formal net. If we are using the call sign WC5GC you can be assured that we are at the EOC and have a formal net in session. Please do not hesitate to check in, even if you have nothing to report at that time. Check in and stay on standby until you have weather to report or you are given an assignment. Mobiles tracking a storm have reporting priority as well as the stationary spotters that are within the area of the severe weather event. **PLEASE ALWAYS GIVE YOUR REPORTING LOCATION** each time you give a report on the weather event to the Net Control Station.

As of **January 5, 2010**, the criteria for a Severe Thunderstorm Warning is **1 inch hail** (the size of quarters) **and/or 58 mph wind**. Previously the criteria was 3/4 inch (penny size) hail and/or 58 mph winds.

Please review all of the STORM SPOTTING safety rules and remember at all times that your safety is the **NUMBER ONE** priority. Check your ready bag and make sure all of your equipment is ready to go!!

SHERMAN WARNING SIREN TEST NET

The next warning siren test will be on **Wednesday March 3, 2010 at 9:00AM.** The net will be called up at 8:40AM from the Sherman EOC using the EOC call WC5GC. The Net Control Operators will either be Johnnie, KD5NIC or Wilmer, WB5DCU. If the test is canceled all stations will be notified at this time. I will send out a roster each month prior to the test to all participants who have e-mail capability listing the station calls and siren numbers.

We are in need of more volunteers to monitor the sirens or as back-ups for the folks that are assigned a siren. This exercise takes approximately 45 minutes to complete. You **DO NOT** have to live in Sherman to participate. **If anyone would like to volunteer to monitor one of the sirens the first Wednesday of each month at 9:00AM give me a call.**

If you have any questions about the siren test net or if you can not participate please give me a call on the radio or on the phone, the phone numbers are at the bottom of the article.

Anyway the warning siren net is going very well. Keep up the good work!!!!

EMAIL COMMUNICATIONS for EVENTS

Please make sure that I have your correct email address and if you change make sure you pass the new address along to me. I am going to be using email more often to inform or remind everyone about events that we will be participating in or to just pass along information that I think might be of interest to all.

ARES MAGNETIC DOOR SIGNS

I ordered more magnetic **ARES/EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT** door signs and like everything else they have gone up in price. I ordered 20 sets and the cost per set (2) is \$10.00. Call me or e-mail me if you need a set.

WHEN TO DISPLAY ARES MAGNETIC DOOR SIGNS

Always display your ARES magnetic door signs when you are storm spotting. Most Public Service and/or law enforcement officers in Grayson County will recognize them and will know what you are doing when storm spotting, especially at night time. **DO NOT** leave them on your vehicle all of the time!!

Whenever we provide communications for public service events or other events you will be ask to display them so all event officials and participants will recognize who you are and what you are doing.

When participating in any events or storm spotting make sure you wear your ARES picture ID badge. Always have your RACES picture ID badge along with you in case an emergency is declared by a public official. Should that happen we will immediately roll over into a RACES net.

If you need magnetic door signs or ID badges please read the respective paragraphs below.
